Congratulations on setting up your class. Here are some instructions for getting started with your students:

## Before You Start

Some schools have content filtering systems / firewalls in place. Please speak to your school's IT / Tech Support team to have the add the following domain to the exception / whitelist:

## To Start Playing

Squiggle Park can be played on an iPad, iPhone, Android device or on the web. Please have your class code and player code card (attached).

### On iPad/iPhone:

1. Download the link from the iTunes store:  
<https://itunes.apple.com/app/id1077048621>
2. Open the app and press the orange play button
3. Enter the group code (the grey 5 digit code)
4. Select a player
5. Enter the player code (the colorful 4 digit code)
6. Start playing!

### On Android:

1. Download the app from the Google Play:

2. Open the app and press the orange play button
3. Enter the group code (the grey 5 digit code)
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## On Web:

1. Log onto Google Chrome

3. Click Student Login
4. Click Play Button

# Tips & Tech

- Print and cut out the player codes and distribute among your class. Some teachers like to laminate them for durability.
- Squiggle Park can also be played at home; students will just need their codes and to follow the web or iPad instructions above.
  - This PDF includes letters for students to take home to their parents explaining the fall pilot; there is a separate letter and code / instruction sheet for each player.
- Ensure your volume is turned on!
- If there are many players in a classroom, you may want to consider using headphones.
- To make the game full-screen on the web, you can click on the square expand icon in the bottom right corner of the screen.
- You can skip the tutorials by clicking the tapping on the screen / clicking the mouse button
- Squiggle Park requires an internet connection to play.
- Squiggle Park can also be played at home; students will just need their codes and to follow the web or iPad instructions above.
- To play Squiggle Park on an iPad you need to download the app from the App Store <https://itunes.apple.com/app/id1077048621>. It cannot be played from a mobile browser.
- The best web experience on a Mac or PC is using Chrome, but we also support Firefox, Safari, Opera and Edge browsers. Internet Explorer is not supported.
- Squiggle Park can be played on 64-bit Chromebooks. We do not support Chromebooks that use 32-bit ARM processors.
- To quit playing the games:
  - On Web - simply close the browser tab and the player will be logged out.
  - On an iPad / iPhone - press the back button in the top left corner of the screen.
